

General Information

Awards:

 Prize money will be paid in accordance with judges' decision. Five or more entries per class, prize money will increase by \$1
 The judges decisions are final. In the absence of competition in any class, the judges have the power to award as they deem worthy.

3. All ribbons & awards must be displayed during the fair.

4. Prize money shall be forfeited by any exhibitor who removes any exhibit(s) in any section or display before 5:00pm on Sunday, the last day of the Fair.

5. Please pick up your prize money or request a payment by cheque at the fair office on Sunday 1-5:30pm. 4-H prize money will be mailed to club leaders.

6. Cheques will be mailed to winners unable to collect their winnings in person, provided the total is \$50.00 or more. Prize money not requested by the calendar year end, December 31, will be considered a donation to the fair.

7. The association will not be responsible for non-payment of prize money offered by others.

8. Points won by a junior in an adult section will not be credited in a junior section.

9. Complaints re: nonpayment or mis payment of prize money must be registered with the fair administration by October 31 of the same year as the fair.

Entries:

The Arrowsmith Agricultural Association's Animal Premise number is BC44HJXVC.

10. The "entry" refers to the written entries pre-registered on the entry forms provided by the Coombs Fair.
11. One 'entry form' per exhibitor.

11. One 'entry form' per exhibitor.

a. Livestock must be entered on a separate entry form from non-livestock entries even if entered by the same exhibitor.

b. Poultry entries must be on a poultry entry form.

c. Horse show entries must be on a Horse Entry Form.

d. 4-H must use 4-H entry forms or club members can be listed with age must use 4-H entry forms.

12. All exhibits must be made or grown by and be the property of the exhibitor or family. In Arts & Crafts and Needlework, exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor within three (3) years of the date of the fair, and not have been previously exhibited for competition at the Coombs Fair.

Livestock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and be in the exhibitor's possession not less than 30 days prior to the Fair.

LIVESTOCK WITHOUT AN ID TAG WILL NOT BE REGISTERED AND WILL BE REFUSED ENTRY AS AN EXHIBIT. 13. One (1) exhibit per class per exhibitor unless otherwise stated. Livestock and poultry exhibitors may enter more than one exhibit per class.

14. Exhibits may not be removed from any exhibit or display until 5pm on Sunday, the last day of the Fair, unless by special permission of the director in charge. (See awards section #5 & 6)

15. Entry forms for children must state the age of the exhibitor.

16. Entry fees must accompany forms. Entry forms can be mailed, or hand delivered and must be received as follows: Poultry & Livestock: Thursday, August 3th, one week prior to the start of the Fair. No late entries for Poultry. \$1.00 extra per late entry in Livestock, no late entries after 5pm Monday before the Fair. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. Horticulture, Floral, Arts & Crafts, Needlework, Domestic Science: on or before Monday prior to the start of the Fair. Entry forms received late, after 5pm Monday before the Fair, will be charged an additional late fee of 50c per entry.
17. Entry forms with entry fees can be submitted from June 1 to the date specified in each section. Mail to: Coombs Fair, PO Box 195, Coombs, BC VOR 1MO; or deliver to the drop box beside Fair office doors; or via email to entries@coombsfair.org.

18. NO ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED

Exhibits:

 The word "Exhibit" refers to the actual article, item or animal being exhibited for competition.
 Exhibits must be on the grounds as follows: Arts & Crafts, Needlework, Photography: items must be delivered on Thursday before the Fair from 6-8pm. Articles cannot be accepted on Friday. Horticulture, Floral, Domestic Science: from 6-7pm on

Thursday or 7:30-9:00am on Friday. Judging of the above sections begins at 10am sharp on Friday.

Livestock: Friday from 5-10pm.

Poultry: Thursday 3-9pm, judged Friday 8am. All other livestock judged during the Fair.

Liabilities & Obligations:

21. The Arrowsmith Agricultural Association will take every precaution to ensure the safety of exhibits entered in the Coombs Fair, but the owners themselves must take the risk of entering them and should any exhibit in whole or part be damaged, injured, or stolen, the Association WILL NOT be liable for the value thereof. Exhibit buildings are under supervision during the hours open to the public and buildings are locked at all other times. A night watch is on the grounds Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.
22. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits that could cause injury, accident, or damage to property or to a person coming in contact with the exhibit shall guard their exhibits to protect the public from coming into contact with them.

23. Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Association from and against all claims, demands, costs, damage of property, which may occur from injury, accident, or damage of property to exhibits being improperly guarded, or the public not being properly guarded from.

24. Each exhibitor shall assume the responsibility for any injury occurring to themselves, or their assistants, while exhibiting or performing.

Family Memories

Mum ~ Grandmother ~ Great Grandmother ~ Aunt ~ Friend

Nan was always a farm girl at heart. Her childhood vision of her life was to live on a farm, grow vegetables, fruit and flowers and raise and tend animals! She followed her passions... created a small garden at her home in Qualicum Beach... was surrounded by dogs, horses and kids - children, that is, not goats (though she loved them too!). For her whole life, Mum loved baking and cooking for family and friends... she was an artist who drew and painted - and a talented photographer long before everyone had a handheld camera! She sewed clothes and knit sweaters for her six kids and 11 grandkids. She was an agricultural scientist by education and she loved getting her hands dirty: she tilled her own soil, mucked out her own horses, knew the business end of a chainsaw, practised crop rotation long before it became a "thing". She was a country Renaissance gal.

Widowed in her early 40's, with six kids, Mum's determination, strength, love and relentless optimism carried her and her whole family - and her extended community - through the tough times and the good times. The Coombs Fair was the perfect canvas, the perfect display table, the perfect riding ring for Nan's good sportsmanship and countless talents - her love of animals, of gardening, art, baking, sewing, and fun! She made an occasion of everything in life - and she shared it with her family and with any and all others who wanted to tag along for the ride (literally), and the adventure! She got her six children involved in the Coombs Fair from the 1960's onwards - whether it was entering the family's Yellow Labrador in the "Pet Parade"; a sewing project in the "Make and Model"; both flat and jumping classes in the horseshow; entering homegrown vegetables and fruit, flowers and arrangements in the horticulture division; baking brown bread, apple pie, cookies, and fantastically decorated cakes in the domestic science category; creating guilts, portraits, photography in the Fair's artistic realm - her passion, talent and sense of fun were catchy! And, like the fearless leader she was, she led her children, grandchildren, great grandchildren - and friends and neighbours - into the halls, the buildings, the joys and the learning of Coombs Fair competition. In every sense of the word, Mum was strong and perhaps nothing showcased that strength and determination better than the annual Ladies Nail Driving Competition at the Coombs Fair! Mum won the event more often than not, and it was, arguably, the feather in her considerable Coombs Fair cap!

In her 95th year, Mum "galloped away" on January 8th of 2023. And, when the family was thinking about a way to honour her many talents, her loyalty, her participation, sense of fun, love of community, and her down-to-earth, farm girl nature - the Annual Nan Nicolls Ladies Nail Driving Competition seemed to capture the essence of our brave, strong, capable, fun and inclusive Mum! So, with huge gratitude to the Board of the Arrowsmith Agricultural Association - The Coombs Fair - we feel honoured to - in turn - honour Mum in this way. And, to boot, imagine our overflowing hearts when the Fair also suggested remembering Nan's passion for gardening by presenting an annual horticulture prize in her name: The Nan Nicolls Best Sweet Pea in Show Award! Lovely as blue ribbons might be, it was always about the doing, the trying, the participating for Mum! So, come one, come all! Have fun! Enjoy! Share!

4-H is an educational program providing the opportunity for urban as well as rural youth to learn valued agricultural and handicraft skills in wide-ranging topics: from animal, plant, and soil sciences; through mechanics, photography, and creative arts. The projects are limited only by the number of adults willing to facilitate each group. For example, youth can train a dog, raise a chicken, fix small engines, or produce fine art. Age-appropriate skills are acquired in looking after and handling the project; during that process, young people learn management skills. Opportunities for learning the skills of leadership are found in every phase of 4-H work. A large variety of travel opportunities are offered due to organization across Canada by club, district, region, and province. All 4-H projects that are made and raised throughout the year in our District are on display at the Fair. The 4-H awards system is designed to aid the individual personal development of the member. Awards are given on the basis of a member's personal growth or achievement, where a member is rated against their own experience and capacity as compared to a standard. All badges and certificates are awarded on this basis. 4-H is a highly respected program for which students can receive high school credits. Boys and girls who have reached their 6th birthday by midnight, December 31 of the previous year and who have not reached their 22nd birthday by midnight December 31 of the previous year are eligible for membership in a 4-H club. The enrollment deadline is

March 1 for all clubs

4-H Rules & Regulations

- Leaders and exhibitors must provide their 4-H ID to gain free entry on to fairgrounds.
- 4-H Entry closing date: July 28, 2023
- Livestock Projects should be on the grounds Friday by 6pm of the fair with the exception of Poultry which should be on the grounds by 6pm Thursday of the fair.
- Non-Livestock Projects should be on the grounds no later than Thursday by 6pm of the fair.
- Open to all 4-H clubs currently enrolled in with the 4-H program. No entry fee required.
- Judging will be done on the Danish System with exception of Ed Boards and interclub activities.
- All 4-H project rules and regulations will apply.
- All 4-H animals must have a 4-H ID number and correct id for their project animal.
- All 4-H Club leaders must carry a copy of all attending 4-H Club Members Parent Member Release form.
- 4-H animals and non animal projects are not eligible for entry in Open Shows. 4-H members may enter additional animals or projects in the OPEN show but must complete the open entry forms and pay the entry fee as indicated on the Livestock Entry Forms or General Entry Forms
- 4-H animals will be stalled in the 4-H sections
- Any clipping or grooming of a 4-H animals at the fair MUST be done by the 4-H member. It is the members' responsibility for cleaning up after this is completed.
- 4-H members are compelled to abide by the SADD rules. Any violations of those rules will not be tolerated.
- All 4-H members are responsible for stall duty.
- Interclub Competitions require 2 or more clubs to qualify.
- If you have a project not listed, please contact the office a judge will be found if warranted.
